Students must complete in total of 128 credits for graduation, of which 43 credits should be from required courses, 37 credits from professional elective courses, 28 credits from general education courses, 2 credits from labor service, 2 credits from volunteer service, and 16 credits from free optional courses. Fifteen credits are free optional courses accepted for taking any courses from all departments.</p> <p>2. Internship (1) and Internship (2) are off-campus internship courses.</p> <p>3. All general education courses must be regulated by the policies of General Education Center. Students must complete the required credit standards of Kainan University.</p> <p>4. "Student Learning Passport" is a required course with 0 credit. The course is regulated by the policy of Kainan University and students must meet the requirement before graduation.</p> <p>5. Students must reach the threshold for English proficiency before graduation. The requirements are regulated by "Kainan University English Exit Requirement Regulations."</p> <p>6. Off-campus internships are arranged in the second semester of the third year or in the first semester of the fourth year. To accommodate off-campus internship arrangements, required courses, such as "Work Ethics and Internship Counseling" must be taken in either the second semester of the second year or the first semester of the third year.</p> <p>7. Students must obtain at least one professional certificate before graduation in accordance with the regulations of Department of Tourism & Hospitality Management.</p> <p>8. Form 5 students must complete at least 12 extra credits before graduation.</p> <p>9. Students must complete key interdisciplinary course program, minor, or double major studies according to "Kainan University Guidelines for Interdisciplinary Learning"</p> <p>10. These courses regulations were passed at the Curriculum Committee Meeting on May 23th, 2023, and approved for future references by Academics Affairs Meeting on May 23th, 2022.</p>
